What is Lifesharing?

Lifesharing involves people with developmental disabilities living and sharing life experiences with supportive persons who wish to share a loving household.

Lifesharing is recognized as not only a place to live, but also experiencing a close personal relationship with a person and or family.

Lifesharing enhances and enriches the lives of individuals and families by offering an alternative to traditional residential living.

The History of Lifesharing

- In 1982, the Office of Developmental Programs (formerly known as the Office of Mental Retardation) started to view the concepts of individuals with ID living with families as opposed to Community Living Arrangements as a viable option.
- Threshold of Berks County started a pilot program in 1982. The ARC of Philadelphia started serving young people in Lifesharing in 1984 (at that time it was known as Family Living which changed due to the false perception that it replaces the biological family)
- By 1997, Lifeshare spread to every county in the state.

Brian's House Inc. began seeking out Lifesharing as a viable option in 2018.

This service is in addition to our numerous CLA's, our Pre-vocational program and Adult training facility, as well as to the Supported Employment services we provide as an agency.

Who is Brian's House?

The Brian's House family is made up of hundreds of individuals, staff, and friends in the community. As a whole, we provide residential, vocational, and every day support for our individuals, who are adults over twenty-one years of age living with intellectual disabilities.

Founded in 1976, Brian's House has been a staple of the Chester County community for over 40 years.
